- Plan and implement the advisory curriculum.
- Lead an advisory group.
- Run workshops, flex activities, and assemblies.
- Plan, organize, and execute parent programs such as parent coffees.
- Organize programming to support mental and physical wellness.
- Support teachers in their work with students.
- Plan and run student of concern meetings.
- Attend to assigned prefecting duties.

### SELECTION CRITERIA

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; Master's degree in counseling preferred.
- Demonstrated experience working with 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.
- Demonstrated experience with middle school advisory programs.
- Strong organizational, communication, and relationship-building skills.
