



Head Novice Rowing Coach

PREAMBLE

Boston College High School is a Catholic, Jesuit, independent school serving approximately 1400 young men across grades 7-12 from various communities across Massachusetts. Founded in 1863, Boston College High School continues its commitment to an authentic formation of the head, heart, and hands within the parameters of the Characteristics of Jesuit Education, the Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm, the BC High Mission Statement, and the strategic plan.

ROLE PURPOSE

Boston College High School is seeking a Head Novice Rowing coach for the Fall athletic season (with the opportunity to stay on for the Spring season). The coach will report to the Head Varsity Rowing Coach and the Athletic Director and will perform a variety of tasks to help the coaches and student athletes.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

Working with the head varsity rowing coach, the head novice coach will lead and oversee the training and coaching of novice and incoming rowers at BC High. This coach should have experience teaching technical fundamentals of the rowing stroke to new rowers, a strong work ethic, and the ability to inspire young athletes and foster a positive team culture and to work hard and grow in the sport. For the fall season, the novice program will be a separate entity alongside the varsity, but in the spring season, this coach will join the rest of the staff, coaching novices, and lower varsity rowers. Strong communication skills are essential; experience coaching at the high school level and/or driving a launch a plus.

Practice schedule: Five to six days a week, M-F afternoons 3:00-6:00 and Sat. mornings 9:30-12:00. (Races are generally on Sundays in the fall.)
