THE SCHOOL

Within each house are several smaller advisories, ensuring that a student's whole person is supported through their counselor, advisory, and head of house along with our award-winning faculty and academic resource center. Our five Centers of Human Excellence provide a way forward for the school to define human excellence in our Jesuit context. They help students fully grow into men of competence, conscience, compassion, and commitment. BC High's athletics are considered amongst the best in the region and country, having been recognized in multiple major publications as well as competing for state championships each year.

HONORS LEVEL COURSES (H)

Admission is by recommendation and is very selective. Honors courses are offered in most subjects except for Religion. Freshman students are only offered honors courses in mathematics and foreign language. English Honors is not offered to seniors.

THEOLOGICAL STUDIES COURSES

Students are required to take a theology course each year. Greek III-H can be taken to fulfill the fourth-year requirement. The curriculum for the theology classes is as demanding as other courses offered. Therefore, we encourage all colleges to include the student's theology grades when factoring a grade point average.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS
