PREAMBLE

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITES

The Intern, as a key team member, will support the planning, execution, and documentation of Center programs/initiatives. They will work closely with students, BC High's Centers of Human Excellence, faculty, alumni, and volunteers.

- Track and document student participation, programs/initiatives, and community engagement.
- Support event logistics for program sessions, workshops, and summits.
- Identify potential volunteers for student programs and coordinate their engagement.
- Update information on Canvas, Airtable, and other platforms.
- Organize programs for alumni and students to meet one another based on industry interest.
- Keep track of people, organizations, and topics of interest submitted by students and teachers.
- Collect data for Shields Advisors resource portal.
- Codify programs through maintaining write-ups of each program for future use, documenting best practices, and identifying opportunities for improvements in future programming.
- Other duties as necessary

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Self-motivated individual with desire to make an impact on students.
- Curious, creative, and driven person who will think outside the box.
- Eager to practice and model innovation as we encourage students to do the same.
- Comfortable working with students and teachers, meeting them where they are, and putting students at the center of all work.

- Eager to learn more about secondary education, innovation, and self.
